8. mood the feeling created in the reader by a literary work (how the story makes you feel)
9. point of view the perspective or vantage point, from which a story is told
10. fiction is prose writing that tells about imaginary characters and events
11. non-fiction is prose writing that presents and explains ideas or that tells about real people, places, objects, or events
12. novel a long work of fiction
13. foreshadowing the use of clues to suggest events that have yet to occur
14. flashback
