THE LITERARY GENRE TYPES

Fiction: the genre represented by short stories and novels that come from the w imagination. Both contain the elements of plot, character, setting, and theme. purpose is to entertain, but also to provide the reader with a deeper understandin life.

Monfiction: the type of writing that deals with real people, places, and events. If contains mostly factual information; the writer selects and organizes the information suit his or her purposes. Subcategories are: biography, autobiography, essay, informative articles, and interviews.



Poetry: the genre that packs all kinds of ideas, feelings, and sound into a few car chosen words which all work together to create a total effect. Poetry may, or may rhyme, depending on the type or form of the poem.

Drama: a story that is intended to be performed for an audience, either on-stage before a camera. Two important kinds of drama are comedy and tragedy. A co is light and humorous; a tragedy ends in disaster.

Oral Tradition (including fable, folktale, parable, and myth): stories which are hall down from generation to generation, by word of mouth, and which often exist, in different versions, across cultures. This genre keeps the past alive.
